

Swallowing problems and feeding tubes in Huntington's disease

Huntington's disease can change your ability to swallow food and drink.

This makes eating and drinking more difficult.


You will notice this when you ...



cough more when you eat or drink



become tired really quickly at meal times



take a long time to finish your food or drink




find that eating is a real **struggle**



are **put off** your food

Huntington's disease can also make eating and drinking unsafe.

- Normally food goes into your stomach.
- When your swallowing gets worse, food can go into your lungs instead.
- You could choke or become seriously ill with a chest infection.



What is a feeding tube?

- It's a small tube which is put into your stomach to give you food, drink and medication.
- You may hear this called a Percutaneous Endoscopic Gastrostomy (PEG) tube and it might look like this.



Will I still be able to eat and drink?

It may not be safe for you to eat and drink at all.

You might take in all food, drink and medication through your feeding tube.



Or you may still have certain things to eat and drink.

You won't have to struggle to eat and drink the large amounts your body needs.

Where will the procedure happen?

- It will take place at a hospital.
- Transport to the hospital and back is likely to be in an ambulance with a nurse.
- You are usually back the same day.




How is the PEG placed?

 It's a small operation that takes about 20 minutes, with a local anaesthetic and sedation.

 It may be a little sore and tender for a day.

 You will be given something to help the pain.



There are choices for you to make ...

- If you have a feeding tube, it may prolong your life so you will live longer with the effects of Huntington's disease
- If you are unable to swallow and you choose not to have the feeding tube, you may become seriously unwell and there is a possibility of your life being shortened
- If you have chosen not to have a feeding tube, we will respect your wishes and keep you comfortable
